Silent-E Spelling Rules

Jumps over 1 blue tile to make a vowel long (luck, Luke)
Long vowel plus one consonant or digraph

one-syllable word:

A, I, O, or U = Silent-E (safe, pine, rope, rude)

 $\mathbf{E} = \mathbf{E}\mathbf{E}$ (feet)

last syllable of multi-syllable word:

A, E, I, O, or U = Silent-E (complete)

/z/ at end = se (rise)

/s/ at end = ce most of the time (rice)

/j/ at end = huge bridge

/jee/ at end = gy (strategy)

/v/ at end = ve (have)

/iv/ at end = ive (expensive)

/cher/ at end = ture (nature, natural)

only consonants at end = consonant-LE (bottle)

/sl/ at end = sle or stle or cel (hassle, cancel, whistle)
